ELTT (Enabling Leadership for Transformational Teaching and Learning for Sustainable Development) is a new professional training program provided by the Sustainability Team of the University of Zurich targeting university educators. The program supports capacity building for leadership in higher education for sustainable development (ESD). Universities can contribute to sustainable development by their teaching and research, and by improving their own operations (see also principle 8 of the Rio+20 Treaty on Higher Education).

- Universities educate future leaders in politics, industry and society and therefore have great replication potential
- They are a persistent part of the community reflecting challenges and contributing to social and technological innovation through their research.
- They are key institutions in our societies contributing to life in urban and suburban regions as employers, consumers, and educators.

Therefore, capacity building for leadership in ESD is of great importance. This is also reflected by the fact that building ESD capacities among educators is one of the five focus areas of the UNESCO Global Action Programme on ESD, which was launched in November 2014. Two other focus areas of this programme are the «whole of institution» approach – addressing the institutional transformation of teaching and learning environments towards sustainability – as well as «advancing policy» for the integration of ESD into education systems.

Objectives

Course participants

ELTT is open to university educators from all Swiss universities (both academic universities and universities of applied sciences) and disciplines.

Methods

The program has three main components:

- ELTT Workshops: Eight workshops, each of approximately three hours, provide input and opportunities for exchange on a variety of topics (see content). The workshops also provide support in developing individual or collective sustainability initiatives.
- ELTT Handouts: For each of the eight workshops, handouts will provide insights into theory and practice of the current discourse of sustainable development in higher education.
- ELTT Webinars: Eight webinars will provide expert inputs from international perspectives. Participants of ELTT will have the opportunity to enter into direct exchange with the experts through online forums.
